From Father Kasel

Praised be Jesus Christ through Mary!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

The month of February is dedicated to increasing our devotion to the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, and to imitating their practice of everyday holiness. May the Holy Family help us each day to strive to be Saints in the service of our good Lord Jesus and His Kingdom! This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. I encourage all of our parishioners to attend Holy Mass on Ash Wednesday. Please see elsewhere in this bulletin for the full schedule of Holy Masses. Plan now to begin Lent with Our Lord at Holy Mass! With the beginning of Lent our attention also turns to penances or sacrifices. Let us be determined in our efforts to make time for Jesus in prayer and be bold in our acts of Charity! First, I encourage all of us to pick some practices to give up or to do. The usual practices, like giving up dessert, candy, pop or television can be good. However, asking for the grace from our good Lord to change a bad habit in our relationship with God and others may be much better. We can also 'think outside of the box' in other ways? A penance does not always have to be something we forgo or give up. It could also be something we add to our daily life. We could add such things as: doing more acts of kindness in word or deed for one's spouse, children, or siblings; choosing to forgive and let go of a grudge; ask for forgiveness from someone; visit relatives in the nursing home; call your parents more often; pray for patience and try to practice it more and more; pray for those who annoy you; thank God for His blessings each day; pray more and with greater love for God – in the morning, afternoon and night; and I think the list could go on. Here are a few more ideas that would bear great fruit: attend daily Holy Mass; monthly confession; daily family Rosary; Chaplet of Mercy; Stations of the Cross and meditation on our Lord's sorrows and Passion; spending time with Jesus in adoration of the Eucharist; praying the Liturgy of the Hours; praying with Sacred Scripture; 15-30 minutes of quiet prayer talking with Jesus and listening to Him in your home; a prayerful walk; talking with a spiritual director; and reading a good spiritual book - I recommend the *Diary of St. Faustina*, the autobiography of St. Therese called *Story of a Soul*, or *the Imitation of Christ* by Thomas a Kempis.

Second, for information on the practice of penance, here is what our Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) teaches us:

"The interior penance of the Christian can be expressed in many and various ways. Scripture and the Fathers insist above all on three forms, fasting, prayer, and almsgiving, which express conversion in relation to oneself, to God, and to others. Alongside the radical purification brought about by Baptism or martyrdom they cite as means of obtaining forgiveness of sins: effort at reconciliation with one's neighbor, tears of repentance, concern for the salvation of one's neighbor, the intercession of the saints, and the practice of charity 'which covers a multitude of sins.' Conversion is accomplished in daily life by gestures of reconciliation, concern for the poor, the exercise and defense of justice and right, by the admission of faults to one's brethren, fraternal correction, revision of life, examination of conscience, spiritual direction, acceptance of suffering, endurance of persecution for the sake of righteousness. Taking up one's cross each day and following Jesus is the surest way of penance.

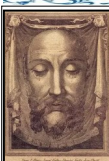

The Grace Within

"Our Lord Jesus Christ, born true man without ever ceasing to be true God, began in His person a new creation and by the manner of His birth gave man a spiritual origin. What mind can grasp this mystery, what tongue can fittingly recount this gift of Love? Guilt becomes innocence, old becomes new, strangers are adopted and outsiders are made heirs. Rouse yourself, man, and recognize the dignity of your nature. Remember that you were made in God's Image; though corrupted in Adam, that image has been restored in Christ.

Use creatures as they should be used: the earth, the sea, the sky, the air, the springs and the rivers. Give praise and glory to their Creator for all that you find beautiful and wonderful in them. See with your bodily eyes the light that shines on earth, but embrace with your whole soul and all your affections *the true Light which enlightens every man who comes into this world*. Speaking of this Light the prophet said: *Draw close to Him and let His Light shine upon you and your face will not blush with shame*. If we are indeed the temple of God and if the Spirit of God lives in us, then what every believer has within himself is greater than what he admires in the skies. Our words and exhortations are not intended to make you disdain God's works or think there is anything contrary to your Faith in creation, for the good God has Himself made all things good. What we do ask is that you use reasonably and with moderation all the marvelous creatures which adorn this work; as the Apostle says: *The things that are seen are transient but the things that are unseen are eternal*. For we are born in the present only to be reborn in the future. Our attachment, therefore, should not be to the transitory; instead, we must be intent upon the eternal. Let us think of how Divine Grace has transformed our earthly natures so that we may contemplate more closely our heavenly Hope. We hear the Apostle say: *You are dead and your life is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ your Life appears, then you will also appear in glory with Him*, who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit for ever and ever. Amen." (from page 1) nourishment in the Eucharist, for in it is made present the sacrifice of Christ which has reconciled us with God. Through the Eucharist those who live from the life of Christ are fed and strengthened. 'It is a remedy to free us from our daily faults and to preserve us from mortal sins.' Reading Sacred Scripture, praying the Liturgy of the Hours and the Our Father - every sincere act of worship or devotion revives the spirit of conversion and repentance within us and contributes to the forgiveness of our sins. The seasons and days of penance in the course of the liturgical year (Lent, and each Friday in memory of the death of the Lord) are intense moments of the Church's penitential practice. These times are particularly appropriate for spiritual exercises, penitential liturgies, pilgrimages as signs of penance, voluntary self-denial such as fasting and almsgiving, and fraternal sharing (charitable and missionary works). The process of conversion and repentance was described by Jesus in the parable of the prodigal son, the center of which is the merciful father: The fascination of illusory freedom, the abandonment of the father's house; the extreme misery in which the son finds himself after squandering his fortune; his deep humiliation at finding himself obliged to feed swine, and still worse, at wanting to feed on the husks the pigs ate; his reflection on all he has lost; his repentance and decision to declare himself guilty before his father; the journey back; the father's generous welcome; the father's joy - all these are characteristic of the process of conversion. The beautiful robe, the ring, and the festive banquet are symbols of that new life - pure worthy, and joyful - of anyone who returns to God and to the bosom of his family, which is the Church. Only the heart of Christ Who knows the depths of his Father's love could reveal to us the abyss of his mercy in so simple and beautiful a way." (CCC 1434-1439)

Through the intercession of the Virgin Mary, St. Joseph and our patrons, St. Michael and St. Paul, may God bless you, your families and our parishes! In Christ through Mary,
