From Father Kasel

Praised be Jesus Christ through Mary!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

Alleluia! He is Risen! Alleluia! Yes, we are still celebrating Easter Sunday! Today is Divine Mercy Sunday and it is the final day of Octave of Easter. After this day we will move into the Season of Easter and continue the celebration of Easter until the end of the day on Pentecost Sunday.

Today, Divine Mercy Sunday, is a day of unfathomable and ineffable graces! I urge all to ask for and celebrate the great gift of Divine Mercy offered by our Heavenly Father through His Son, Jesus Christ! We will have opportunities to visit our Lord in at least one of our churches on Divine Mercy Sunday.

We will have time for private prayer with our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament; the Sacrament of Confession offered; the Chaplet of Divine Mercy recited; and finally Benediction and the Divine Praises! Plan now to celebrate our Lord's infinite Mercy this Sunday and join with other parishioners in our special event. Divine Mercy Sunday is a day of great promises from our Lord Jesus, particularly when we ask Him to share with us His unfathomable and ineffable Mercy! Here is a brief summary of the message of Divine Mercy:

"The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us - all of us. And, He wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

A - Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

B - Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.

C - Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

This message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread."

The message of Mercy grows through various devotional practices. These practices are:

F - Feast of Divine Mercy: celebrate Divine Mercy in your parish!

I - Image of Divine Mercy: venerate the Image of Divine Mercy and place on in your home!

N - Novena of Divine Mercy: pray the Novena of Divine Mercy!

C - Chaplet of Divine Mercy: pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy each day!

H - Hour of Mercy: 3-4pm is the Hour of Great Mercy - ask Jesus

"In repeated revelations to St. Faustina, Our Divine Savior makes it clear that the fountain is His Heart, the water is His mercy, and the vessel is trust.

I have opened My Heart as a living fountain of mercy. Let all souls draw life from it. Let them approach this sea of mercy with great trust (Diary of St. Faustina, 1520). On the cross, the fountain of My mercy was opened wide by the lance for all souls — no one have I excluded! (1182). I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: "Jesus, I trust in You" (327). The graces of My mercy are drawn by means of one vessel only, and that is — trust. The more a soul trusts, the more it will receive (1578).

In the Diary of St. Faustina, we hear Our Lord reminding us that we can depend upon His love ... that He alone is worthy of our trust: **I never reject a contrite heart (1485). Sooner would heaven and earth turn into nothingness than would My** (continued on page 4)

WORDS TO LIVE BY:

“Oh how much I am hurt by a soul’s distrust! Such a soul professes that I am Holy and Just, but does not believe that I am Mercy and does not trust in My Goodness. Even the devils believe in My Justice, but do not glorify My Goodness. My Heart rejoices in this title of Mercy.” (Diary of St. Faustina, #300) “Proclaim that Mercy is the greatest attribute of God. All the works of My hands are crowned with Mercy.” (Diary, #301)
“When once I asked the Lord Jesus how He could tolerate so many sins and crimes and not punish them, the Lord answered me, ‘I have an eternity for punishing [these], and so I am prolonging the time of Mercy for the sake of [sinners]. But woe to them if they do not recognize the time of My visitation.’” (Diary, #1160)
“The Lord said to me, ‘The loss of each soul plunges Me into mortal sadness. You always console Me when you pray for sinners. The prayer most pleasing to Me is prayer for the conversion of sinners. Know, My daughter, that this prayer is always heard and answered.’” (Diary, #1397)
“Jesus: ‘My child, life on earth is a struggle indeed; a great struggle for My Kingdom. But fear not, because you are not alone. I am always supporting you, so lean on Me as you struggle, fearing nothing. Take the vessel of Trust and draw from the Fountain of Life - for yourself, but also for other souls, especially such as are distrustful of My Goodness.’” (Diary, #1488)

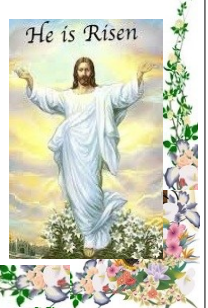

Trust in the Infinite Mercy and Goodness of our Lord

"In whatever state of soul you find yourself, remember that you live in God, who is infinitely Good. Unite yourself to Him; remember that He is offering you His help and His Grace here below, with the promise of His reward in the future life; He is only waiting for a word from your heart to protect and defend you. Thus, drive from your mind the discouraging thoughts that assail you.

Remember that we are soldiers of Jesus and as such we must quickly combat all our fierce enemies, who spare nothing to lead us to ruin. Discouragement does nothing but weaken the strength of the soul. Left to itself, ivy only creeps along the ground, but attached to a big tree, it rises to the greatest heights: It is a faithful image of the soul who walks attached to God, victorious over the devil, the world, and the flesh; no temptation can knock it down and no passion can conquer it.

Throw yourself, then, into the arms of your dear Jesus who is waiting for this filial and confident thrust of your entire being in order to fortify your soul, purify it, and give it Herculean strength in the ocean of His most Pure and Divine Heart. If you sometimes feel your soul pricked by some sharp and poisonous thorn, don't let this disturb you but be more on guard than ever, so that it does not pierce and penetrate it.

Seclude your heart and gently withdraw your will into a place of peace and quiet, keeping your soul spotless for God, whom you will always find in the depths of your heart, because of the integrity of your intention. He will assure you that everything happens to test you, so that in this way you will be able to do good and merit the crown of justice prepared for you by God in His infinite Mercy and goodness. Courage, then, go forward on the narrow way of the Saints!" (Blessed Clelia Merloni († 1930) Blessed Clelia founded the Congregation of the Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in 1894.)

I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.

On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity.

The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy. (699)" (info and quotes taken from www.thedivinemercy.org)

9 ways you can be guilty for the sins of others

"Sin is a personal act. Moreover, we have a responsibility for the sins committed by others when we cooperate in them..." (CCC 1868)

1. By counsel (to give advice, one's opinion or instructions.)
2. By command (to demand, to order, such as in the military.)
3. By consent (to give permission, to approve, to agree to.)
4. By provocation (to dare.)
5. By praise or flattery (to cheer, to applaud, to commend.)
6. By concealment (to hide the action, to cover-up.)
7. By partaking (to take part, to participate.)
8. By silence (by playing dumb, by remaining quiet.)
9. By defense of the ill done (to justify, to argue in favor.)

(Note: To participate in the sins of another person means that one is just as guilty of the sin as the one who committed the sin. For example, if you encourage someone to have an abortion, you are guilty of the sin of abortion.)
