From Father Kasel

Praised be Jesus Christ through Mary!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. This celebration reminds us of our calling to welcome Jesus each day into family life and to give thanks to our Heavenly Father for the blessing of living our Catholic Faith in family relationships.

This week coming Thursday we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God (January 1)! This is a Holy Day of Obligation – please see this bulletin for Holy Mass times for this Solemnity. Remember that we celebrate the Grace of Christmas Day in the Octave til the evening of January 1. The Christmas Season will extend through the Baptism of our Lord, January 11, 2026.

Also, let us be mindful that as we begin a New Year, we have new opportunities to grow in Love, Joy and Peace with God, one another and within ourselves. I encourage you to make practical resolutions for the New Year, both spiritual resolutions and human resolutions. Practices such as increasing prayer, increased frequency of the reception of the Sacrament of Confession and giving of time to God are ways to grow in Love, Joy and Peace. Through the intercession of the Mary, the Mother of God and St. Joseph, with our patrons, St. Paul and St. Michael the Archangel, may our Good Lord grant us a blessed year of growth in love for Him!

This weekend I share with you an excerpt from a letter by St. Athanasius (b. 296 - d. 373), Bishop and Doctor of the Church:

“The Apostle tells us: *The Word took to Himself the sons of Abraham, and so had to be like His brothers in all things.* He had then to take a body like ours. This explains the fact of Mary’s presence: she is to provide Him with a body of His own, to be offered for our sake. Scripture records her giving birth, and says: *She wrapped Him in swaddling clothes.* Her breasts, which fed Him, were called blessed. Sacrifice was offered because the Child was her firstborn. Gabriel used careful and prudent language when he announced His Birth. He did not speak of “what will be born *in you*” to avoid the impression that a body would be introduced into her womb from outside; he spoke of “what will be born *from you*” so that we might know by Faith that her Child originated within her and from her. By taking our nature and offering it in sacrifice, the Word was to destroy it completely and then invest it with His own Nature, and so prompt the Apostle to say: *This corruptible body must put on incorruption; this mortal body must put on immortality.*

This was not done in outward show only, as some have imagined. This is not so. Our Savior truly became man, and from this has followed the salvation of man as a whole. Our salvation is in no way fictitious, nor does it apply only to the body. The salvation of the whole man, that is, of soul and body, has really been achieved in the Word Himself.

What was born of Mary was therefore human by nature, in accord-

ance with the inspired Scriptures, and the Body of the Lord was a true body: It was a true body because it was the same as ours. Mary, you see, is our sister, for we are all born from Adam. The words of Saint John: *The Word was made flesh*, bear the same meaning, as we may see from a similar turn of phrase in Saint Paul: *Christ was made a curse for our sake*. Man’s body has acquired something great through its communion and union with the Word. From being mortal it has been made Immortal; though it was a living body it has become a spiritual one; though it was made from the earth it has passed through the gates of Heaven. Even when the Word takes a body from Mary, the Trinity remains a Trinity, with neither increase nor decrease. It is forever perfect. In the Trinity we acknowledge one Godhead, and thus one God, the Father of the Word, is proclaimed in the Church.” Through the intercession of Mary, the Mother of God, St. Joseph, St. Paul and St. Michael, may God bless you, your families and our parishes in the New Year, 2026!
