From Father Kasel

Praised be Jesus Christ through Mary!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

I wish you a blessed Epiphany and Happy New Year of our Lord, 2024!

The month of January is dedicated to devotion to the Most Holy Name of Jesus: let us reverently pray His Holy Name and make reparation to our good Lord for the many times that His Name is spoken with irreverence, ingratitude and hatred!

It is a long tradition in the Church to make a public announcement of the upcoming Feasts and Seasons that we will celebrate. There is an established, formal announcement that is used for this occasion. Here is more information for you to learn about what we call the Epiphany Proclamation:

"The proclamation of the date of Easter and the other moveable Feasts on Epiphany dates from a time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date. The number of Sundays that follow Epiphany, the date of Ash Wednesday, and the number of Sundays that follow Pentecost are all computed in relation to Easter.

Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts in the liturgical year for many years in advance, the Epiphany proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the Resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of Faith which are celebrated each year." (from www.usccb.org)

"In Cathedral and other principal Churches, after the Gospel has been sung, the approaching Feast of Easter Sunday is solemnly announced to the people. This custom, which dates from the earliest ages of the Church, shows both the mysterious connection which unites the great Solemnities of the year one with another, and the importance the Faithful ought to attach to the celebration of that which is the greatest of all, and the center of all Religion. After having honored the King of the universe on the Epiphany, we shall have to celebrate Him on the day which is now announced to us, as the conqueror of death." Know, dear brethren, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy, we announce to you also the joy of His Resurrection, who is our Savior. On the 14^{th} day of **February** will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten Season. On the 31^{st} day of **March** you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the **12th** day of **May** will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus (continued on page 4)

Epiphany marks the occasion of a timehonored Christian tradition of "chalking the doors." The formula for the ritual-adapted for 2024 is simple: use the blessed chalk received after Holy Mass on Epiphany Sunday and write the following above the entrance of your home: 20 + C + M + B + 24 and say the prayer accompanying the chalk.



The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi — Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar — who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless this house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "24" at the end mark the year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request that Christ to bless those homes so marked that He stay with those who dwell therein throughout the entire year. The **chalking of the doors of a home** encourages Christians to dedicate their life at home to God and to others. Seeing the symbols over our doors can help to remind us, while passing in and out on our daily routines, that our homes and all those who dwell there belong to Christ. It also serves as a reminder of the welcoming the Magi gave to Jesus. We should strive to be as welcoming to all who come to our homes to visit us!


